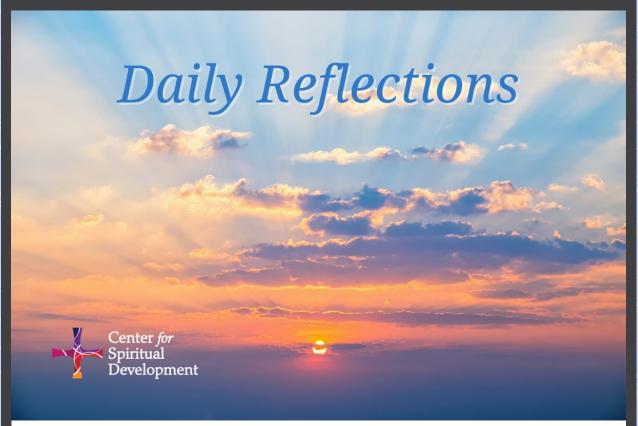

"Return again, return again, return to the land of your soul. Return to who you are, return to what you are, return to when you are Born and reborn again."



Reflection

The other day, my spiritual director reminded me we were in the time of *Elul*, the last month of the Jewish year, and a time of spiritual reflection in preparation for the coming New Year, *Rosh Hashanah*, and *Yom Kippur*, the Day of Atonement. While I am Catholic, I have participated in this season for nearly thirty years and have found it to be spiritually anchoring.

It is a moment to look back as well as forward, to examine self and

relationships with others and with God. During this season, God's mercy is sought and requested. Penance and making amends are necessary along the journey, and we intentionally call to mind and heart those who have passed. Traditional practices can include daily reciting of Psalm 27 and blowing the *shofar*.
