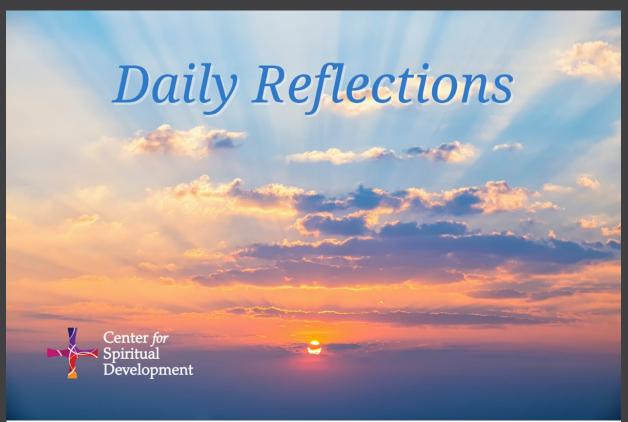

I DESIRE MERCY, NOT SACRIFICE

Reflection

The image below captures the profound spiritual truth that mercy and love are an extension of divine glory. In this composition, Jesus -- as the hungry and homeless -- blends his presence with a woman embodying his mercy and kindness. The connection between their figures is fluid, suggesting a seamless unity between human compassion and the Divine, implying close union with God.

The lighting plays a crucial role in expressing transformation. At first, the woman is in shadow, engaging in acts of care — feeding, sheltering, loving. As the composition progresses, Jesus' glory emerges through her actions, illuminating both figures in a radiant and transformative glow. Somehow it seems that human mercy transcends and emerges as divine sanctity.

The image reflects impressionist fluidity and surrealist dream-like qualities—soft edges emphasize warmth and movement, while surreal distortions suggest a spiritual revelation unfolding beyond physical perception.

Without words, the image conveys the message that serving the least among us is an act of worship, a process of sanctification — love becomes the bridge between heaven and earth. It is as if you reached out to the sky and have touched the tassels of Jesus's garment. It invites viewers into reflection, asking them to see Jesus in those they care for and to see his glory revealed through their own hands.
